Dear School Administration and Staff,

We want your students to add their voices to the conversation on why Safe2Tell Wyoming is important! Safe2Tell Wyoming is a confidential school safety tipline that can be utilized to report concerns dealing with bullying, self-harm, drugs, school safety, and more. We invite you and your students to participate in a contest to create a poster that will be featured in presentations, our website, and in schools across Wyoming!

Topics:

Grades K-2 - Topics can include: Safe2Tell Wyoming; who to go to when you need help; school safety; or the difference between telling vs. tattling.

Grades 3-6 - Topics can include: Bullying; cyberbullying; or how Safe2Tell Wyoming can help.

Grades 7-12 - Topics can include: Bullying; cyberbullying; drugs; mental health; sexting; social media responsibility; or school violence.

Eligibility

This contest is open to all Wyoming students currently enrolled in grades K through 12. There will be three winning posters chosen, one from each of the following categories:.

K-2

3-6

7-12

Awards

Teachers of the winning students will be notified by phone or email by May 1st, 2020.

K-2. Winner will be awarded a classroom pizza party*



- 3-6. Winner will be awarded a classroom pizza party*
- 7-12. Winner will be awarded \$100*

The winning students' teachers will receive \$100 for their classrooms.

***The School Districts must be willing to accept all award funds and distribute them to the winning student(s) and teacher.**

Rules

1. Any K-12 student currently enrolled in a Wyoming school may participate. Posters may be created by an individual student, by groups of students, or an entire class. However, if participating in a group, the group will split the \$100 award among the group members.
2. All posters must be submitted by April 15, 2020 at 11:59 pm MST.
3. The School District must agree to accept the award funds and distribute them to the winning teacher and students.
4. Schools may submit more than one poster.
5. Posters will be submitted using the provided guidelines. Failure to do this will result in disqualification from the contest.
6. If poster is a collaboration of several students, all students must attend the same school.
7. The finished poster must measure 8 1/2" X 14".
8. The poster must be submitted with consent and release forms from a parent/guardian of each student.
9. Students should leave 3" X 8 1/2" blank space at the bottom of their posters to allow for a Safe2Tell Wyoming logo to be added.
10. The teacher will need to provide the following information with each submission:

- Name of student(s)
- Grade Level of student(s)
- Theme chosen
- School Name
- Name of Teacher
- Phone Number of Teacher
- Email of Teacher

Digital Submissions:

Scan poster in high resolution and save it as a pdf, jpeg, or Adobe Illustrator File. If you use pictures in your poster, make sure that they are high resolution. If you use a template, you still need to save the poster as a pdf, jpeg, or Adobe Illustrator file.

Do not include multimedia materials.

Save the poster as "school_Lastname_grade"



The teacher needs to email submission and student submission form to safe2tellyoung@wyo.gov in the same message as two separate attachments.

Use of Digital Images in Posters: Safe2Tell Wyoming encourages students to incorporate their own original artwork in their posters, whether through graphic design programs or by their own artistic hand. If students wish to incorporate digital images created by others, these images must conform to copyright laws. It must either be purchased from the owner or the student must obtain written permission from the owner.

A signed release form must accompany each poster submission to the Safe2Tell Wyoming Poster Contest. In any of the above cases, if students incorporate someone else's work in their poster, appropriate credit must be given upon submission, including: the author's name and the date the image was created (if available), the database or website from which the image was obtained, and the terms under which the image is used (e.g., public domain, Creative Commons license, etc.). Poster entries that do not conform to the above guidelines will be disqualified. Safe2Tell Wyoming encourages students to practice good digital citizenship. Judging Criteria

Posters will be judged by a committee chosen by Safe2Tell Wyoming.

Posters should incorporate the student's creativity and should address this year's theme in some way.

This year's topic must appear in the poster.

Posters will be judged on originality, creativity, visual impact and how they engage this year's theme.
