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Safe2Tell Wyoming Presents Award to Elementary School Student

Kemmerer, Wyo: On May 23, 2019, Safe2Tell Wyoming will recognize a Kemmerer Elementary School student for creating a Safe2Tell Poster. Safe2Tell Wyoming challenged Wyoming elementary students to create posters that covered issues such as school safety, telling vs. tattling, and who is a trusted adult.

Easton Backman, a second grader from Kemmerer Elementary School, won the Safe2Tell Wyoming Poster Contest for the elementary school level. Backman received a \$100 prize towards a class pizza party and \$100 will be awarded to Backman's teacher, Sierra Collins. Backman created a poster about trusted adults and who you should go to when you need help.
